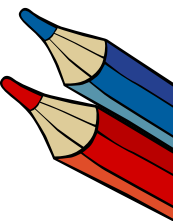


IndigiScapes Activity Book

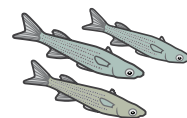
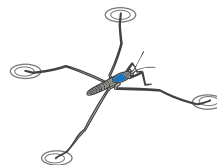
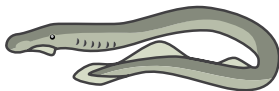
The Jandai translation of 'Yura' in English is 'welcome'.

Food webs show how plants and animals are connected.



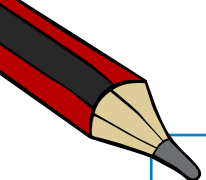

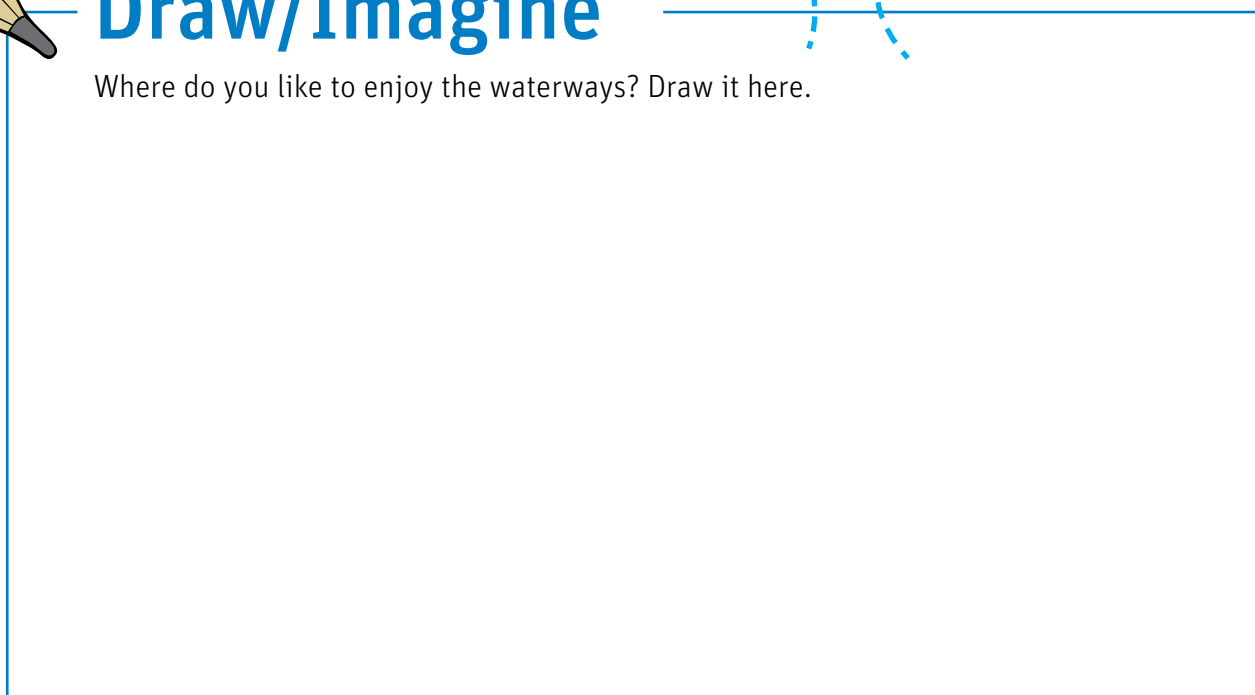


Did you know that

towards the ocean?



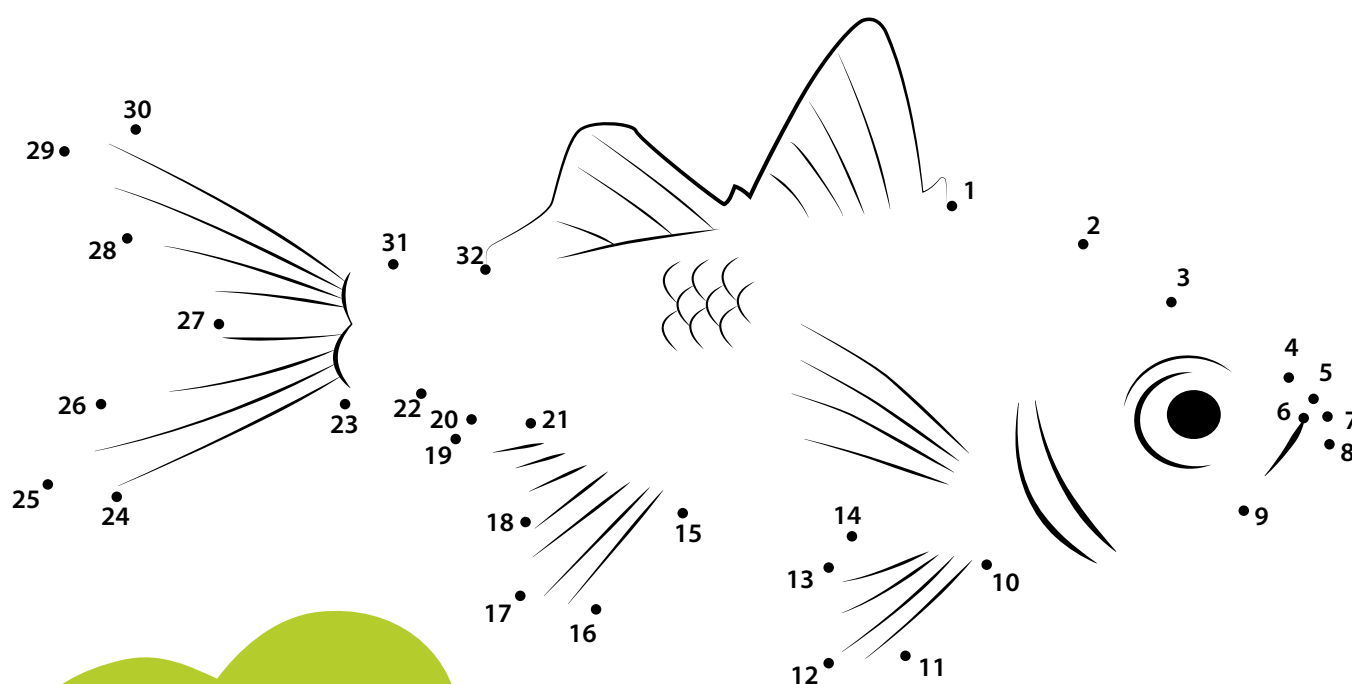
Draw/Imagine

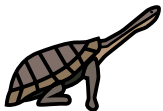
- ☐ Plant some native ground covers, shrubs and trees around creeks and river banks

☐ Creek



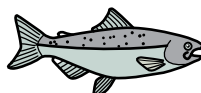
